
Dear Kyle,

I saw [REDACTED] this past Tuesday to see how his implants were doing. They were placed a year ago and were restored about 6 months ago. As you know, most implant failures occur in the first year. Certainly this is the most frequent time period when implants begin to show signs of problems. As such, I try to do a follow-up around this time with our patients for whom we've done substantial implant treatment.

I made PA's of the fixtures and adjacent teeth, and I also made digital dental photos. The main thing that I would like to communicate to you is this: your work is awesome! The esthetics you achieved – from the natural incisal edges to the natural root forms to the shade match with his remaining dentition is as good as anything I've ever seen. No kidding. The result is both beautiful and natural – and most of all, Mr. [REDACTED] is very happy with his smile. He claims to have had a good experience throughout. Radiographically, there is not a single thread exposed – the bone appears to be absolutely stable.

I know that you're not a big fan of hard copies of dental records, but I really wanted to give you a copy of Mr. [REDACTED] photos as a way of saying thanks for allowing me to help you with his care. There is nothing more rewarding to me than being part of a team that provides such nice results and satisfied, happy patients. Since I saw Mr. [REDACTED] on Tuesday, I have shown these photos to several dentists here in Preston Center, and every single one was very impressed – and of course, I gave you full credit (it's not a bad thing for your colleagues to know that your treatment is that good).
